

REVIEWING SPORTS FLOODLIGHTING STANDARDS AT COMMUNITY RUGBY CLUBS

The RFU recommends the following standards of sports floodlighting for rugby union

MATCHES AT LEVELS 2 TO 5

ALL OTHER MATCHES & ALL TRAINING 100 LUX (0.5 UNIFORMITY)



Where a club is unable to achieve these standards or does not have an up to date lux certificate, a risk assessment should be carried out.

This document is designed to help clubs identify common sense considerations and risk factors when reviewing the safety of sports floodlighting from a playing and officiating capacity only.

- **FLOODLIGHT MASTS** Are the floodlights 5m from all touchlines?
- Are the floodlight masts padded?
- Is safety padding in place for training and warm ups as well as matches?
- If the floodlights are within the 5m pitch perimeter have additional safety measures been adopted?
- Check the stability of the floodlight masts
- Check for weak spots in the floodlight masts
- Check for protrusions and sharp edges on the floodlight masts
- Check that bolts & connectors are safely concealed, including ground sockets
- Check for wear & tear and any rust

Remember to monitor the stability of the masts in high winds



Discuss the quality of lighting provision with players and officials to ensure they have no concerns before, during and after activity.



Keep a record of each risk assessment for reference

LIGHTING LEVELS

- Are all lamps (or luminaires) emitting light?
- Is the light from each unit consistent?
- Standing under the goalposts and looking down the pitch, can the posts at the other end be seen clearly?
- Can the ball be seen clearly if it reaches a height of
- Can each player see all others players on the field of play?
- Can you see clearly from one end of the pitch to the other?
- Can you see clearly from one side of the pitch to the other?
- Can all pitch side barriers be seen clearly from the centre spot?
- Is the light on the pitch consistent or are their darker areas?
- Is lighting consistent for the whole pitch, including run off and dead ball areas?
- Do the lamps give off a glare that effects your vision when you look directly at the floodlights?
