Summary of Essential Elements of Citing/Referee/s Report/Footage

The Referee's report states:

'Bath 4 was in possession attacking in Sale's half. After a stoppage the TMO asked me to review potential foul play. After reviewing I deemed Sale 3 had made an upright tackle on Bath 4 causing direct head on head contact with a high degree of danger. No mitigation was applicable."

The footage was consistent with the Referee's report (see details in findings, below).



The report from the Bath Rugby Head of Medical states:

'Dave Attwood sustained a 4cm wound above his right eye which required 4 stitches post game. There is no suspicion of head injury - in keeping with a glancing blow to the head rather than blunt trauma.

Dave Attwod is expected to be available for selection for the coming week.'

Summary of Player's Evidence

The Player admitted committing an act of Foul Play that justified a Red Card.

He accepted he got the tackle wrong and he should have been lower. The Player was caught out by a last moment step by the Bath player off of his right foot. The Player accepted that, whilst that might possibly be a form of mitigation, it was not sufficient to mitigate the foul play to a Yellow Card because it was not a sufficiently significant change.

The Player apologised to the Bath player by text message after the match and was very remorseful for his actions.

We were told the Player is highly committed. He has played at least 100 professional games over 13 years. He coaches at community level.



Findings of Fact

1. The ball was passed to Bath 4. When Bath 4 received the ball the Player was approximately 5m from him.

2. The Player was defending right to left.

3. As the two players came in close contact with each other, Bath 4 stepped on his right foot, which caused a change in his direction. The change in direction was not significant.

4. The Player's head made direct contact with Bath 4's head.

5. The contact with Bath 4's head was caused recklessly. The Player did not intend to hurt Bath 4 or make head contact with him.

6. The actions involved a high level of danger because there was forceful contact with the head by a hard part of the body.

7. The Player did partially lower his body height from an upright position, but not sufficiently to avoid direct head contact.

8. Bath 4 sustained an injury, as described by the Bath Rugby Head of Medical, which was caused by the Player's recklessness.

Number of weeks deducted: 3 weeks

Summary of reason for number of weeks deducted:

The Player was cited for foul play in the match between Ospreys v Sale Sharks (EPCR) on 12 December 2021. The EPCR Disciplinary Committee found the Player joined a maul in a 'highly reckless' way, with force and caused dangerous head contact with an opponent. The Player received a 3 week suspension. He was granted a Coaching Intervention and served a 2 week suspension. The nature of the Coaching Intervention was to address the manner of joining mauls (not tackle technique).

This RFU Panel considered it finely balanced whether the Player earned full mitigation (3 weeks) or a lower level in light of that December 2021 offence.

On the one hand: 1) the December 2021 offence was recent (being less than 12 months ago and less than one full season); and 2) it also involved reckless and dangerous head contact.

On the other hand: 1) the foul play was different given this foul play occurred in the tackle and not a maul; and 2) we are required to consider the Player's disciplinary record in the context of his whole playing career.

There are some Player's with far shorter careers than this Player's, who have a disciplinary matter in their past, but are nonetheless treated as having a good record because it occurred (say) 4-5 years previously. That is despite the fact that the mere passage of time is not a factor referred to in the Regulations and there is no reference to weighting past offences based on when they occurred.

Even though the Player has a disciplinary matter less than 12 months ago, we judge he is capable of earning 50% mitigation in the context of having just one prior matter in a long 13 year career. We have reached this conclusion weighing all the relevant mitigating factors. We recognise a different Panel could quite properly come to the conclusion that less than 50% mitigation has been earned. Lest this decision be referenced in the future, it turned on its own facts and is not intended to be 'precedent setting'.
